

**Course Descriptions:** (Please check current course schedule for listing of available classes.)

**ENSL 2001 & 2003: BASIC & HIGH-BASIC GRAMMAR**

Students learn to write and speak basic to high-basic structures in English grammar such as: simple present, simple progressive, simple past, and future tense forms; singular and plural nouns and pronouns; prepositions of time and place.

**ENSL 2005 & 2006: INTERMEDIATE & HIGH-INTERMEDIATE GRAMMAR**

Students review basic grammar and are introduced to intermediate to high-intermediate structures. Students write and speak sentences and questions in using appropriate tenses, modal verbs, comparative and superlative forms of adjectives, gerund or infinitive complements, and more.

**ENSL 2007 & 2008: LOW-ADVANCED & ADVANCED GRAMMAR**

Students review intermediate grammar and are introduced to low-advanced to advanced structures. Students write and say complex sentences using simple and perfect tenses, active and passive voice, gerunds and infinitive complements, and more.

**ENSL 1021 & 1022: BASIC & HIGH-BASIC CONVERSATION**

Students practice listening and speaking. Students learn the vocabulary, pronunciation, and grammar needed to communicate in a variety of conversational contexts.

**ENSL 1024 & 1025: INTERMEDIATE & HIGH-INTERMEDIATE CONVERSATION**

Students practice listening and speaking skills in more complex situations. Students will increase speed and accuracy in speaking through a variety of conversational practice.

**ENSL 1026: ADVANCED CONVERSATION**

Students practice listening and speaking for academic and work situations. This class will emphasize vocabulary building, listening, and note-taking strategies, and presentation skills.

**ENSL 1027 & 1028: LOW-ADVANCED & ADVANCED PUBLIC SPEAKING**

This class is for low-advanced and advanced-level students to learn how to speak in front of an audience and give different types of formal presentations. Students will improve their confidence in speaking in formal and informal situations.

**ENSL 2010 & 2011: BASIC & HIGH-BASIC READING**

Students will improve comprehension of simple texts through vocabulary building and reading strategies.

**ENSL 2013 & 2014: INTERMEDIATE & HIGH-INTERMEDIATE READING**

Students will read and understand intermediate to high-intermediate level texts through vocabulary building and reading strategies. Students will also learn strategies to read more quickly and accurately.

**ENSL 2015 & 2016: LOW-ADVANCED & ADVANCED READING**

Students prepare for academic, college-level reading assignments. Students will read more quickly, accurately, and critically by increasing their vocabulary knowledge and reading skills.

**ENSL 2028 & 2029: BASIC & HIGH-BASIC COMPOSITION (Writing)**

Students learn the parts of a sentence and write sentences with correct grammar. Students also learn to connect sentences to form paragraphs and practice editing their writing.

**ENSL 2031 & 2032: INTERMEDIATE & HIGH-INTERMEDIATE COMPOSITION (Writing)**

Students learn to organize paragraphs and write paragraphs with topic sentences, details, and conclusions. Students also practice editing their writing.

**ENSL 2033 & 2034: LOW-ADVANCED & ADVANCED COMPOSITION (Writing)**

Students will prepare for academic, college-level composition by writing essays that include a thesis statement, supporting details, and conclusion. Students will also write for a specific audience and will practice editing.

**ENSL 2024: TOEFL PREPARATION (Intermediate/Advanced level students only)**

Students will learn reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills needed to do well on the TOEFL entrance exam.

**ENSL 2023: ENGLISH FOR GLOBAL BUSINESS (Intermediate/Advanced level students only)**

Students will learn business vocabulary used in American and international businesses and through reading, writing, and speaking activities.
