NOTE: All general education/support courses and nursing courses required for the Practical Nursing Certificate program or the Associate Degree in Nursing program must be passed with a minimum GPA of 2.5.

Programs

Associate of Applied Science Degree

ADN – Associate Degree Nursing (2-Year RN)

Associate Degree Nursing graduates receive an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing and are eligible to apply for the NCLEX-RN, the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses. Registered Nurses (RNs) may work in a variety of health-care settings.

ADN II – Associate Degree Nursing (LPN to RN)

You are a Licensed Practical Nurse (with a valid Colorado LPN license) applying to the ADN program.

Attend an information session

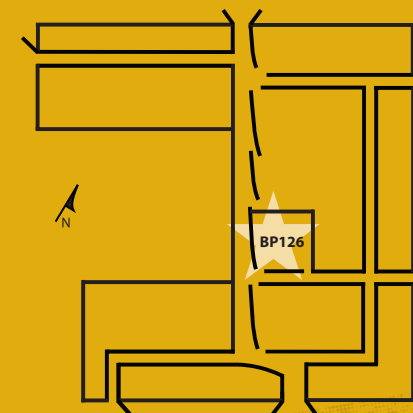
