IMPORTANT NOTES & GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- This degree worksheet is subject to change. Please work closely with an advisor to create your academic plan and ensure a successful experience at FRCC.
- Credits transferred to FRCC are not official until evaluated by Admissions & Records.
- An absence of 12 months constitutes a break in enrollment and invalidates this review and possibly this plan of study.
- No developmental courses may be applied to this degree.
- Minimum Grade Point Average 2.0; only grades of "C" or better may be applied to this degree; grade of "B" or better required for ENG 121.
- Minimum 15 degree-applicable semester credits must be completed at FRCC.
- For a formal degree audit, please fill out a Degree Audit form, available online or at Admissions & Records, and submit to Admissions & Records.
- Submit graduation application, transfer credits, and credit for prior learning to Admissions & Records by deadline and complete CAAP exam (see Class Schedule for dates).
- The official graduation contract is based on the FRCC catalog in effect when the student formally matriculated into the program of study under which she/he plans to graduate.

Statewide Elementary Education Articulation Agreement

The following four-year schools participate in this agreement:

- Adams State College (Interdisciplinary Studies)
- Colorado State University – Pueblo (Liberal Studies)
- Fort Lewis College (Interdisciplinary Studies)
- Mesa State College (Liberal Arts)
- Metropolitan State College of Denver (Behavioral Science and Human Development)
- University of Colorado at Boulder (History)
- University of Colorado at Colorado Springs (English, History/Social Studies, Modern Foreign Languages, Science, and Mathematics)
- University of Colorado at Denver (Individually Structured Major)
- University of Northern Colorado (Interdisciplinary Studies)
- Western State College (Interdisciplinary Studies)

A transfer student from a Colorado public community college who has earned an Associate of Arts degree designated for the elementary education track as defined in this agreement will need to complete no more than 66 credits to earn the baccalaureate degree at the four-year institution (60+60-66 transfer agreement). However, admission to the four-year institution and its teacher education program are not guaranteed.

A grade of B or better is required for English Composition (ENG 121). This is a standard teacher education admission requirement in Colorado.

To complete the AA graduation requirements, students will complete the final 19 credits designated by the four-year institution to which they intend to transfer.

Students need not complete the AA degree to transfer any or all of the courses to the institution whose list of final 19 credits they are following.

The four-year college or university will accept all credits in this agreement earned within ten years of transfer. Courses earned more than ten years earlier will be evaluated on an individual basis.
