- Concurrent enrollment classes count for **both** high school and college credit and will be on both transcripts
- **No tuition or fees** – it's paid for by the school district!
- Taught by **qualified** high school or FRCC instructors



## Enrollment steps

1. **Apply to FRCC** to obtain a student identification number (S number)
  - Your high school will provide directions to apply
  - College Now registers you in the college classes
  - Respond promptly if College Now calls – there may be registration issues
2. Complete the **concurrent enrollment agreement form**
  - Must be signed by the parent and student
  - Submit form to high school counselor by their deadline

# How to be a successful college student!



## High School vs. College Courses

- **PACE:** One of the fundamental differences between high school and college level courses is that students learn content outside of class. This means your instructor is responsible for giving you the resources you need to learn once class has ended. Your instructor is not responsible for presenting every single kind of example that exists. Courses may **require 2-3 hours per credit per week of work** outside the classroom.
- **ATTENDANCE:** In high school an instructor may spend multiple days covering one section. In college, an instructor may only spend one day on the material. If you miss a class, you are responsible for learning the material you missed; even if the absence was excused.
- **KNOW RESOURCES:** Because of these differences, it is important for you to know your resources. The most effective resource is usually the other students in the class. Organizing study groups can help offset some of the challenges you will face.


• Your high school will provide a **Course Information sheet**

- **Guaranteed Transfer (GT)** – means the course will transfer to any public Colorado college or university. For private or out-of-state colleges, you'll need to contact the receiving school.
- **Non Guaranteed Transfer classes** are usually career and technical education (CTE) classes like Culinary, Interior Design and Welding. These classes can typically be applied to a AAS degree or certificate programs.

Also check your class **Syllabus** - a contract that includes important information on:

- What you'll accomplish
- How you'll be graded
- Important dates
- Attendance policy
- Save syllabus for future reference on transfer eligibility!

**This FRCC college course emphasizes the planning, writing, and revising of compositions, including the development of critical and logical thinking skills. This course includes a wide variety of compositions that stress analytical, evaluative, and persuasive/argumentative writing.**

ENG 121 is a statewide Guaranteed Transfer (GT) class. This class will transfer to other public colleges and universities in Colorado. It is not guaranteed to transfer to out-of-state schools.

**College Now Programs at Front Range Community College/Larimer Campus**

Front Range Community College's College Now program allows students to earn both high school and college credit for the same FRCC class. In High School Select, students take FRCC classes that are conveniently offered at the high school.

All curriculum and expectations are the same as in a college class—the only difference is the location. Students should expect that High School Select classes will be more challenging with a heavier workload than most typical high school classes.

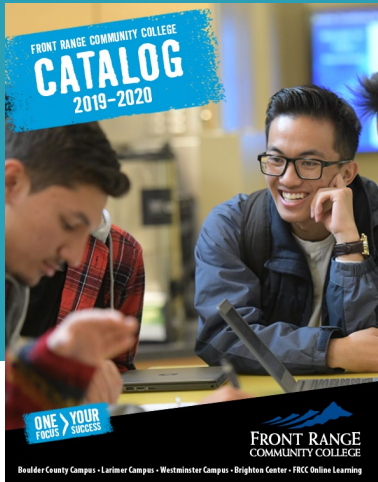
- **Drop Date –**

- Drop course through eWolf (Add or Drop icon) by drop deadline
- Course disappears from college transcript, no financial obligation
- Notify your high school counselor

- **Withdrawal (W) –**

- Withdraw from course through eWolf (Add or Drop icon) by withdrawal deadline
- Course shows on college transcript but does not affect GPA
- School district may bill you for a W or a F
- Can also affect future financial aid at FRCC
- Notify your high school counselor

# Opportunities for next semester or next year!



## Campus Select

- Attend the FRCC campus where you have the entire catalog of classes to choose from!
- Tuition is paid for by the school district but **students pay for course fees and textbooks.**
- For each credit hour, students should expect **2-3 hours** per week at home studying.
- Contact College Now or your high school counselor.

## Career Pathways

- Year long, 2 hour sessions, Monday – Friday for **Juniors or Seniors**
- An opportunity to do in-depth career exploration while earning high school credit and optional college credit
- Sophomores and Juniors - ask your counselor about attending our **Preview Day** in January



- Graduating this year? Ask College Now about:
  - **Ascent** – 5<sup>th</sup> year of paid tuition by school district
  - Next steps for enrolling as a FRCC college student
  - **Transcripts** – order official transcripts sent directly to your receiving college through [www.frontrange.edu](http://www.frontrange.edu) and **eWolf** (found in upper right corner)
    - Print or save **unofficial** transcripts for your records!
