Teaching through Continuing Education offers a great opportunity to share your knowledge and work with students and professionals in your community. We offer daytime, evening, and weekend classes for lifelong learners. Our instructors fall into one of two categories:

Non-Credit Adjunct Instructors

Adjunct instructors are employees of the college. For many courses, but not all, Continuing Education will work with the adjunct instructor to develop the course learning objectives, guidelines, and course materials. Instructors are expected to create lesson plans and instructional activities that will support students in meeting those learning objectives. Instructors report to and receive teaching assignments from Continuing Education program development personnel.
