## ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) Program Goals

- Improve academic English to be successful in college and career.
- Sharpen 21<sup>st</sup>-century skills needed for success in career and college. These skills include problem-solving, critical thinking, creative thinking, collaboration, and technology.
- Develop and practice leadership skills.

## Class Levels and Cost

All classes focus on improving and applying communication skills: speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Instructors adjust educational resources to fit student needs. Students practice communication appropriate for the workplace, education, and community. Below are the ESL classes and levels for this Fall 2022.

- **Basic/Low Intermediate**  
7 weeks session. The cost for each session is \$275
- **Intermediate**  
7 weeks session. The cost for each session is \$275. Two themes to improve your skills:
  - Problem Solving and Decision Making
  - Leadership and Community Service
- **Advanced: Academic Reading and Writing**  
15 weeks session. The cost is \$550
- **College Preparation for English Language Learners** (Required class to take college credit courses)  
8 weeks session. The cost is \$100  
Students explore careers and find supportive services, like financial aid at FRCC
