

Career Pathways College Credit Option

Is college credit right for me?

YES!

Students who...

- have a strong career interest in their program area
- intend to work in the field of their program area
- intend to pursue an FRCC degree or certificate in their program area, and/or
- are committed to earning good grades

... may benefit from earning college credits in Career Pathways! Get a jumpstart on college requirements without the cost of tuition in Career Pathways!

Students will need to submit a *Concurrent Enrollment Agreement and Registration* form to sign up for college credit. This form will be provided to students on the first day of fall semester.

MAYBE NOT...

Students who...

- have general interest in their program area only
- do not intend to work in the field of their program area
- intend to pursue a 4-year degree or a degree/certificate program in a different area, and/or
- are unsure of their commitment to earn good grades

... may not benefit from earning college credits in Career Pathways. Stick with high school credit and participate fully in all aspects of your Career Pathways program!

Students will need to submit the *Waiver of College Credit* form to waive college credit. This form will be provided to students on the first day of fall semester.

Students and parents should be aware of the following information when deciding on college credit:

- **College grades are part of the student's permanent college record and may affect eligibility for future financial aid and scholarships, as well as acceptance into other colleges and/or programs.**
- Students will use the College Opportunity Fund (COF) stipend for college coursework. Please see www.frontrange.edu/COF for details.
- All curriculum, assessments, and requirements will be the same, whether students select college credit or not.
