



## Westminster Campus Nursing Program FAQ

### **How can I find information on the process to apply to your Nursing Program?**

It is highly recommended that you attend one of our Nursing Program information sessions. If you cannot attend, you may contact the Nursing Program Assistant/Advisor at [wcnursing@frontrange.edu](mailto:wcnursing@frontrange.edu) for information.

### **When/where are the nursing program information sessions held?**

Nursing Program information sessions are held the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday of each month at 6pm in Room B0353. (Note: No meetings are held in July or December, or if the campus is closed.)

### **What is covered at the nursing information session?**

The Nursing Program admission, required prerequisite courses, and estimated program costs.

### **Where do I find the list of prerequisites for the Nursing Program?**

The current prerequisites for the Nursing Program are listed in the Front Range Community College (FRCC) [Catalog](#). More details may be obtained by attending a nursing information session.

### **How long is the Nursing Program?**

In addition to the prerequisites taken prior to entry into the program, there are four semesters in the Nursing Program and the program is two years in length. (There are no nursing courses during the summer.)

### **Is it a full- or part-time program?**

Our program is a full time, day time program (Monday through Friday) and requires a full-time commitment.

### **Are there evening classes?**

Nursing courses are not offered in the evening. However, nursing prerequisite courses are offered during the day or evening. Once admitted, clinical hours associated with nursing courses may include evening, night and weekend hours.

### **What degree is earned at the end of two years?**

Upon successful completion of the Nursing Program, you will receive an Associate of Applied Science degree in nursing (AAS).

### **Will I be a Registered Nurse (RN) once I have completed the two-year nursing program?**

After successful completion of the nursing program, students are eligible to apply to take the NCLEX-RN exam (National Council Licensing Examination). Upon passing this exam, and approval by the board of nursing, you will receive RN licensure.

### **Is the Front Range Community College Westminster Campus Nursing Program accredited?**
